**OVERVIEW OF MODERN PALESTINE-ISRAEL HISTORY AND WHY IT IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES OF OUR TIME**



Steven Salaita was born in Blairfield, West Virginia to immigrant parents: his mother was born in Nicaragua to Palestinian parents and his father's ethnic background is Jordanian/Palestinian.

Salaita is an American, author of 8 books and many articles on Arab-American studies and the depiction of the Middle East in American media. Indigenous people, dislocation, immigration, race, and multiculturalism are also favorite topics.

He has held positions at several universities in the U.S. and recently served as the Edward W. Said Chair of American Studies at the American University of Beirut.

The Gustavus Myers Center for the Study of Bigotry and Human Rights recognized Salaita's latest book as "one that extends our understanding of the root causes of bigotry and the range of operations we as humans have in constructing alternative ways to share power."

## Spotlight: Music Ministry

Interview with Director of Music — Karol Nowicki



Our recent transitions at St. Clement's include not only calling a new Rector, Pastor Heather Hill, but also a new Music Director, Karol Nowicki, who has been with us now for six months. Karol comes to us with a depth of experience that includes singing in the choir at St. Andrew's Cathedral, and positions there as librarian and music program manager, assisting then-

Director of Music John Renke (read about some of his other choral experience in the May 2017 issue of *Ke 'Alemanaka*).

He's still observing and learning how things are done at St. Clement's, but is already getting positive feedback from the congregation, "people are very kind to each other here." He's always open to suggestions "as long as we can manage it." As he's quick to point out, "the size of the group is very small and sets up some limitations in terms of the repertoire that we can present. When everybody shows up, we can do good things. But with even one person missing, it makes a big difference."

One of his goals for the choir is to be more courageous. "I think they can be challenged more and can do things that are more difficult. For the most part they seem to enjoy

when I bring something that's challenging. Down the line, as we improve, this will attract more people's interest and hopefully, we'll start to get inquiries from people who want to join in."

"The music serves a purpose [in the service]... it leaves more of a mark than just speaking; it's more powerful, more easily absorbed. When it's just the choir singing the anthem, there is a different sense and reverence. If we match really well with the readings and the sermon, it helps to reinforce the message. They build on each other."



He's enjoying his time here working with the choir and is especially grateful to have such a talented musician as organist River Kim to accompany them. For now he's taking joy in what he's doing and hopes that the choir is also having fun. As they grow together, he observes, "it's twice as powerful when you do something with love."

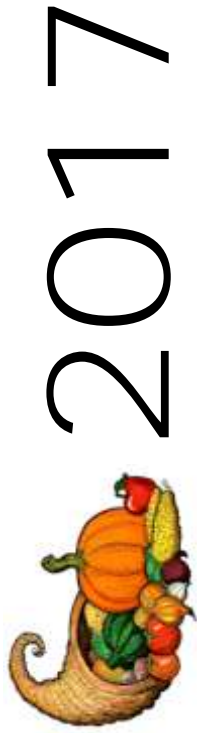

find many. In other words, Pope Clement's refusal to grant Henry an annulment was not an exception to "the rule." Henry was not being singled out as one Catholic monarch among many who were receiving annulments while he was not. Granting annulments was not "the rule."

- While yes, Henry or no Henry, the English Reformation was bound to happen, it still happened when it did because of Henry. Yes, it was Archbishop Cranmer who led the beginning of the English Reformation, but it was Henry, intentionally or unintentionally, who launched it.

- All this being said, while Henry was not a quintessential monarch let alone "Supreme Head of the Church," the question becomes, does this reality diminish the good work of God and God's people in the reformed Church of England, the inclusive Episcopal Church, and the ecumenical Anglican Communion? Can Henry trump what is Henry's legacy? Not to compare Henry with Jesus, but to quote Nathaniel and Philip, two of Jesus' earliest disciples considering his call:

*"Nathaniel said to Philip,  
'Can any good thing come out of  
Nazareth?'*

*Philip said to Nathaniel,  
'Come and see.' " ~ John 1:46*

## A View from the Pew

*“Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!  
How unsearchable are God’s judgments!  
How inscrutable are God’s ways!” ~ Romans 11:33*



The View in October was about the history of the Church of England, out of which our Episcopal Church and Anglican Communion arose. More precisely, it discussed the role Henry VIII played in the establishment of the state Church of England. To be sure, it was controversial, but I was unprepared for the abundance of inaccurate information, misinformation, and excuses shared with me after it appeared. However, in keeping with the old adage that, *“Without knowledge of our past we are like trees with shallow roots ~ doomed to fall,”* maybe we should review:

- There is a big difference between “divorce” and ‘annulment.’ Divorce means a lawful marriage has been legally terminated. Annulment means what was believed to be a lawful marriage was not. As a result, a couple was never legally married. In much of Christianity marriage is a sacrament, meaning it is sanctified by God. Hence, an unsanctified religious marriage is not a marriage.
- In the Roman Catholic Church, to which Henry belonged, there are no divorces, only annulments. However, in Henry’s life and times, only a Pope could grant an annulment.
- Ann Boleyn was not Henry’s first wife, Catherine of Aragon (a region in Spain) was. Ann was next. Henry married Catherine after her first husband Arthur, Henry’s older brother and heir to the throne, died at 16 years of age. Depending on the source, before Henry could marry Catherine, an annulment or a special dispensation from the Pope was necessary. This was a result of a culturally uninformed, biased, and as a result inaccurate English translation from the Hebrew in Leviticus implying a man cannot marry his brother’s wife ~ ever ~ and if he does, not only will he dishonor his brother, but he and his brother’s wife will be childless.
- To remove the legal-religious obstacles that might prevent Henry from marrying Catherine, Henry’s father, Henry VII ~ who was still king and who first arranged Catherine’s marriage to Arthur and then her marriage to Henry ~ sent religious representatives to argue before Pope Julius II two points. First, Arthur’s marriage to Catherine was null and void because, as a result of their youth, their marriage was never consummated. Second, later in Deuteronomy and contrary to earlier in Leviticus, it says a brother is actually obligated to marry a brother’s widow if there are no sons to continue the deceased’s family lineage.
- Depending on the source, Pope Julius granted an annulment or a special dispensation, Henry and Catherine were married, they had two daughters named Mary and Elizabeth who survived into adulthood, but they had no sons who did the same. After 24 years of marriage, by which time Henry had long been king, when it became apparent Catherine could no longer have children, he began a relationship with Ann Boleyn in hopes of siring a son and male heir to the throne.
- When Ann became pregnant, anticipating she might bear a son, Henry decided to marry her. However, in order to marry Ann, he had to have his marriage with Catherine annulled. Ironically, Henry’s religious representatives argued before the new Pope Clement VII that the very same concern in Leviticus that was successfully refuted 24 years earlier in favor of Deuteronomy to allow Henry’s marriage to Catherine was now grounds to annul their marriage. Not surprisingly, Pope Clement rejected the argument and refused to annul Henry’s and Catherine’s marriage.
- In the meantime, anticipating the negative ruling from the Pope, Henry secretly married Ann anyway. And, when it became clear the Pope was not going to change his mind, after intense solicitation by Henry and his advisors, English Parliament declared Henry the “Supreme Head” of the Church of England, usurping the authority of the Pope and Roman Catholic Church, establishing the first state Church of England, and inaugurating the English Reformation.
- After being made head of the Church of England, Henry appointed Thomas Cranmer as Archbishop of Canterbury when Archbishop William Warham passed away. Even though he previously held only minor positions within the Church, in addition to having the backing of Ann Boleyn’s influential family, Cranmer also had assisted Henry in his argument for an annulment before the Pope. Shortly after becoming Archbishop, Cranmer annulled Henry’s marriage to Catherine and confirmed his marriage to Ann.
- Despite popular mythology to the contrary, Pope Clement was not a “Spanish Pope” conspiring with the Kingdom of Spain to undermine Henry’s aspirations on the Continent. There have only been two Spanish popes in history and both were dead long before Henry became King. Additionally, there was no conspiracy. Henry’s father, King Henry VII, himself arranged for Catherine ~ who was the daughter of King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain ~ to first marry Arthur and then to marry Henry so he could further *his* aspirations on the Continent.
- Again, contrary to popular mythology, Popes were not in the habit of granting annulments to Catholic monarchs. While I’m confident Popes have granted annulments to other Kings and Queens somewhere in history, I have been hard-pressed to
